Thermal Imaging Cameras

Fever screening via thermal cameras has emerged as a useful tool in the detection of elevated body temperature, which can indicate the presence of a fever, a symptom of Coronavirus and potential early intervention. With built-in artificial intelligence algorithms, the camera has the ability to measure multiple people from a distance of 9.8 feet and 4.3 feet wide away, with a reported accuracy up to $\pm 0.3^{\circ}\text{C}$, enabling fast and efficient assessment without personal contact.



Deep Clean and Decontamination

Utilising technical and specialised cleaning skills to provide decontamination, cleaning and containment solutions. The service includes isolation and segregation of any affected areas; sterilisation of ventilation systems, often overlooked as part of deep cleans; deep cleaning to reduce the spread of any contamination, using CDC and EPA approved disinfectants; fogging machines or decontamination units.
