# Fire Door Inspection Training



With the new requirements to inspect fire doors approaching implementation in January 2023 (for certain types of buildings) the need to ensure this task is undertaken has increased in importance. Whilst WMC currently provide fire door surveys, undertaken by qualified and experienced assessors, we are offering a short site-based training course to enable clients' teams to complete their own inspections in between the times a more formal survey is undertaken by a dedicated specialist.

## Delivery

Delivery of the course will be by an experienced, qualified fire door assessor.

## Format

The course will be site based or virtual, lasting for 2 hours.

Our site based format will involve a classroom-based session followed by a site tour to identify several fire doors and give the delegates a chance to for Q&A and potentially undertake a sample inspection.

Our virtual format will give employees access to an online conferencing portal for the delivery of the course. Virtual courses also feature interactive Q&A components, as well as opportunities to engage with the tutor as if delivered in-person.

## Content

The course will cover the following key aspects of understanding fire door inspections;

- Certification – understanding what a certification means, how/where to find the information, what it looks like and what to do if certification cannot be confirmed.
- Gaps – looking for gaps that are deemed excessive and negate the operational capabilities and effectiveness of the door. What is an acceptable gap, how to measure it and what to do if gaps are felt to be too large.
- Seals – understanding the role of seals, where they should be located, are they missing, damaged etc and what to do if they are.
- Hinges – how to check that door hinges are correct, sufficient in number, not damaged or missing etc.
- Closes – checking that the door closes firmly into the latch without sticking on the floor or catching on the frame.
- Glass – understanding what is acceptable glass to have in a fire door, how to check and note its overall condition.





# Fire Door Inspection Training

## Outcome

The course will enable a delegate to complete a fire door inspection and a certificate of attendance will be issued. The course does not provide a qualification that allows the delegate to state they are now an accredited fire door inspector/assessor.

**Note:** although this is not an externally accredited course, it will enable in-house teams to conduct routine fire door checks.

## Cost

£750 ex VAT per session and can accommodate a maximum of 12 delegates. No previous experience is required. Delegates could include, FMs, PMs, Surveyors, Security staff, etc.
